



### The Alliance Cultural Foundation: Huatung Reading Program

The Huatung Reading Program introduces the online Reading A-Z program to schools and after-school shelters in the Huatung region. The initiative aims to encourage students in the first to ninth grade to listen and read English through e-books as well as nurture their self-learning habit and ability; the program also monitors every student's learning progress. Introducing the program is in effort to help change the lack of English teaching resources in the rural regions of Taiwan.

18<sup>th</sup> to 20<sup>th</sup> December, Huatung Reading Program initiator Debra Lin and 15 volunteers visited the Si Pao Primary School, Renewal Foundation, Yi Le Le Shelter, Taibalang Elementary School, Gangkou Elementary School, Chenggong Church, and Changbin Junior High School; together they guided 114 students to use the Reading A-Z program. Additionally, ACF will co-organize activities throughout the school year and summer holidays to help nurture students to self-learn English, and will expand the initiative to more schools in the Huatung region in the program's future. We hope that through oral reading exercises, students who once were hesitant to speak English will demonstrate more confidence in their speaking ability.

### 2019 Sharestart Asia Conference: Grassroots Development

7<sup>th</sup> December marks the fourth annual Sharestart Asia Conference. Held at the National Chiayi University, the event earned support from the Chiayi City Government, National Chiayi University's Teacher Training Center and The Hugo Foundation of Culture and Education.

Sharestart founder Benson Chang and 17 Sharestart lead teachers led participants to co-learn and practice the Sharestart method considering the 2019 Master Framework for the 12-year Basic Education Curriculum Guidelines. The conference provided participants the opportunity to explore the Sharestart method on a deeper level.

Throughout 2019, Sharestart's lead teacher team coached practicing Sharestart teachers in effort to support their learning progress. They designed practicing curriculum for beginner, intermediate, and advanced levels. Sharestart's current focus is spreading the method in the Yunlin, Chiayi and Tainan areas. This year, a total of 420 participants attended the conference, among them 44% of the teachers are from the Yunlin and Chiayi areas.



### Taiwan Connection: Promoting Classical Music School-wide Initiative

11<sup>th</sup> December, at the Sihwei Elementary School in Taichung, Taiwan Connection's Artrich String Quartet performed Haydn's String Quartet in C major, Op.76 No.3, Hob.III.77 "Emperor". Students were encouraged to imagine different scenes when listening to the piece and to share their stories.
