Junyi School of Innovation: Prevention of the Coronavirus

At the start of February, Taiwan's Ministry of Education announced the delay of the spring semester. In response, Junyi formed a prevention team to enforce measures according to government regulations. Additionally, the team seeks out areas on campus that may need added prevention. With help from Junyi parents, body temperatures are taken at the school entry; those who are coughing or have body temperatures exceeding 37.5°C are denied entry.

In order to prevent a cluster of people being infected by the virus, recent events such as the spring opening ceremony, parent-teacher meeting, and Junyi's student recruitment day were all conducted online. Teachers were also encouraged to utilize online learning resources for students to continue their learning.
